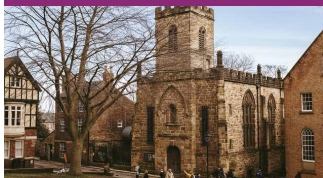

Proximity to Park & Ride: 10 minute walk from City Centre.

Wharton Park is Durham City's hidden gem located behind the railway station on Windy Hill alongside North Road. At the summit of the park is the Battery, a castle-shaped folly. From here you get an amazing panoramic view of the city, including Durham Cathedral, Durham Castle and the railway viaduct, accommodating the East Coast Mainline. This Victorian park is a firm favourite amongst families, with all generations enjoying the park's scenery, play areas and café.

The park re-opened in May 2016 following a full restoration, thanks to the funding from the Heritage Lottery Fund. Now, the Peoples Park is a destination in its own right. Visit the Heritage Centre for lunch in its glass-fronted café, listen to live music, watch theatre performances in the outdoor amphitheatre and enjoy the spectacular views of Durham City from the Battery. Explore the park's beautiful surroundings and discover the community garden maintained by the Friends of Wharton Park.

This extraordinary Grade II listed building has been at the heart of life in Durham City for more than six centuries. Every Saturday, the Town Hall opens its doors free of charge offering everyone the chance to discover its rich and fascinating history. Audio guides, interactive information points and short films help visitors find out more about this stunning building situated in the city's Market Place.

Learn about powerful Prince Bishops, the evolution of local government and how the Town Hall developed from the first timber Guildhall of 1356. Discover more about the historic and ongoing roles of Mayor and the Mayor's Bodyguard, who have called the Town Hall home since 1602. The Trade Guilds and Freemen of Durham City, for centuries the political and economic power in the city, have been resident at Guildhall since medieval times. They meet here to this day, working for the betterment of Durham.

Other displays showcase colourful local characters such as Joseph Boruwlski (1739 - 1837), the 3ft 3in tall "Little Count" who, after performing at the grandest Royal courts of Europe, retired to Durham in 1790.

Visitors and locals alike are encouraged to come along to experience this unique part of Durham's heritage.

Please note: Occasionally the Town Hall may be partially or fully closed due to private or civic functions.

From prehistoric stone tools to contemporary artworks, the Oriental Museum reveals the art and archaeology of the great cultures of North Africa and Asia. Come and see ancient Egyptian mummies, porcelain created for the Chinese Imperial Court, Japanese fashion, and head-hunting swords from Borneo. If you are visiting with children, there is plenty to do. Try out dressing up, follow our regularly changing museum trails and play our gallery games.

RHS Members - free entry every Monday, and the first Saturday of the month, throughout 2024. The entrances to the Botanic Garden are at the Visitor Centre and the Howlands Park and Ride.

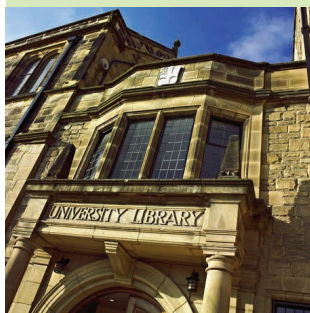

Opening times: As four times vary please check online on our website listed above. Tickets can be purchased online a week in advance or from Palace Green Library reception, situated near the Castle entrance.

Built in the Norman period as an imposing fortress, Durham Castle's story is entwined with that of the Prince-Bishops of Durham, whose semi-regal status made them some of the most powerful and wealthy men in the country. The Castle, together with Durham Cathedral, makes up the iconic UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Durham Castle is a Grade 1 listed building, an accredited museum, as well as a vibrant living and working community. It is home to University College, the oldest college of Durham University and over 100 students are resident during term. In view of this, entrance to the public is by guided tour only. Visitors should be advised there is limited wheelchair access within the castle.

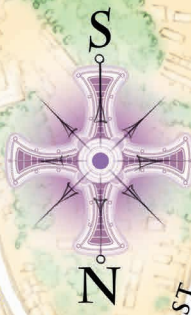
Explore Durham Cathedral, part of Durham's UNESCO World Heritage Site, and its 1,000 year story. See the resting places of iconic Northern saints St Cuthbert and the Venerable Bede, and step into the home of medieval Benedictine monks. Encounter the cathedral's daily rhythm of worship or explore its modern history and art. Look up to see stained glass windows and pause by the County Durham Miners and local regiment memorials.

Climb the central tower for views across Durham city, see the treasures of St Cuthbert in the cathedral's museum or dive deeper into the history on a guided tour. Find Durham-inspired gifts in the shop and enjoy light bites in the café or outdoors in the Monks' Garden. Head outdoors to explore Durham's riverbanks on a walk around the cathedral.

Park and Ride 2024

There are three Park and Ride sites at Belmont, Sniperley and Howlands.

From April 2024, these sites will all be open Monday - Sunday. In addition, from May 2024, they will be open Bank Holidays (except Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Year's Day)

Park and Ride Bus fares

Child (under 16 accompanied by adult over 21) - free.

English concessionary passes accepted -free after 9:30am Mon -Fri and all day Sat. Before 9:30am County Durham concessionary pass holders can travel for 50p.

Tickets can be purchased in the site buildings and accept coins (not notes) and cards, including contactless. Payment can also be made via contactless card or cash on the P&R buses themselves.
